Step 1: Prep the Area	
Sweep the pool deck to remove leaves, dirt, and debris.	
Hose down the deck if it has stubborn stains.	
Trim any overhanging branches or shrubs.	
Ensure the area is free from tripping hazards.	
Step 2: Remove the Pool Cover	
Use a pool cover pump to remove standing water.	
Brush off leaves and dirt with a broom or skimmer net.	
Fold and lift the cover off the pool with at least 2 people.	
Step 3: Clean and Store the Cover	
Rinse the cover thoroughly with a garden hose.	
Use mild soap or a pool cover cleaner for stubborn stains.	
Allow it to dry completely before folding and storing.

Remove all winterizing plugs from returns and skimmers.	
Reinstall drain plugs and lubricate O-rings.

Test equipment switches for proper operation.	
Reattach ladders, rails, and diving boards.	
Step 5: Top Up the Water and Prime the System	

Use a garden hose to top up the pool until the water level reaches the middle	
of the skimmer.	
Prime the pump by filling the pump basket with water.	
Turn on the filtration system and check for leaks.	
Step 6: Water Testing and Balancing	
Test the water chemistry using a testing kit.	
Adjust alkalinity, pH, and calcium hardness levels as needed.	
Step 7: Shock and Algaecide Treatment	
Dissolve shock granules in a bucket of water before adding.	
Distribute the solution evenly across the pool.	
Run the pool filter overnight.	
Step 8: Final Filtration and Cleaning	
Run the filtration system for at least 24 hours.	
Skim the surface, vacuum the pool floor, and brush the walls.	
Clean or backwash the filter if necessary.	
Step 9: Retest Pool Water for 5 Key Parameters	
Test the pool water chemistry for key parameters.	
Adjust levels as required and add Trichlor tablets.
